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## From the Director's Desk . . .

Dear Families & Friends of PC2:

Happy Spring!

When I think of Spring, I think of new beginnings and having survived the storm, so what I want to share with you has to do with looking forward to a positive future.

If you want to have a positive future, you need to plan for it. Just like planning a trip, you use GPS, travel tickets, what

you need to sustain you while you are on the road, etc. You need to know the facts and what steps to take. That is what we do best. If we do not know, we find out who we can ask for directions.

We can help! Let's talk about possibilities and the positive things that can happen when you plan for what a good day looks like for your son or daughter as a thriving adult. Most importantly - what do they say they want for their future?

As we consider their future, we can help them plan ahead - what services would they need to have good, full days? What resources would they need? It's not going to happen by itself.

We can sit and worry about what we don't have. Maybe even listen to rumors and speculation of what's coming. Or we can take each day as it comes and use the resources available to us. Planning for the future takes work. When your loved one is no longer in school, what does a good day look like for them?

I hope that your loved one has signed up for DDA and that they are eligible for services. Once a year they will have an assessment to determine need and be assigned a waiver (<u>https://informingfamilies.org/topic/dda-services/</u>)

Then they can request a service (Washington Administrative Code about authorized services through DDA: <u>https://app.leg.wa.gov/WAC/default.aspx?cite=388-825-058</u> & DDA service fact sheets: <u>https://fortress.wa.gov/dshs/adsaapps/about/factsheets/DDAFactsheets.aspx</u>)

The keywords - "authorized services," which means your loved one has been assessed, has demonstrated a need for services, and has been assigned a case resource manager, who can get services approved. You will need to prove the need and have it requested / approved before services can be delivered.



## SKILL BUILDING GROUPS

These loosely structured groups focus on building key, developmentallyappropriate skills allowing participants to better engage in group settings and build positive relationships with peers. Skills targeted may include: communication, self advocacy, sportsmanship, play/leisure, emotional regulation, & functional life skills. Most groups are cohort-style, meaning the same group of peers is building skills together across a certain number of weeks. All are welcome to attend & activities are modified to best suit participants' interests, motivation,

## SPECIAL INTEREST GROUPS

Similar to our skill building groups, our special interest groups provide participants with an opportunity to engage with peers and develop specific developmentally appropriate social skills, such as appropriate humor/banter, self advocacy, sportsmanship, flexibility/tolerance, and functional life skills. These groups are centered around a shared interest, such as arts/crafts or board games, to allow for more opportunities for natural engagement and friendship building. All are welcome to attend & activities are modified to best suit participants' interests, motivation, and skill level!

## SKILL BUILDING COURSES

As our most structured groups, these courses provide evidence based social skills training to neurodiverse children, adolescents, and adults. These programs provide instruction on a targeted skill each session, such as making & keeping friends, handling conflicts, and addressing bullying. Structured learning is balanced with plenty of time to practice the skills learned with their peers!

## PLAY & HANGOUT GROUPS

These groups are focused on creating a welcoming and safe place for everyone. Natural opportunities to build social skills, make friends, and learn to be part of a group are created using a flexible, "no pressure," hangout-style format.





**REGISTRATION OPENS MARCH 17:** Pre-Registration is required. Class sizes are limited. To register online, visit our website at **www.piercecountywa.gov/PCSR**. To register by phone, please call **(253) 798-4199**. Register in person at the **Lakewood Community Center**, 9112 Lakewood Drive, Lakewood, WA 98499 Monday through Friday between 9:00 am - 5:00 pm.



**DDA:** Pierce County Parks Specialized Recreation programs are supported by DDA funding; respite money may be used. If using DDA funds to register please have the participant's case manager contact information on-hand.



GENERAL BILLING INFO: Case managers will be billed monthly, using the hourly reimbursement rate based on the quarter hour.

## **Unexpected Absences**

You will not be billed out of pocket for any illness or behavioral related issues as long as we are notified prior to the absence.

If you/the participant is sick or experiencing:

• Behavioral issues: If for any reason you feel you/the participant is not able to safely attend classes, please call and inform us at your earliest convenience. Safety is of our utmost concern.

• If you have any type of contagious illness: Please do not attend classes until you have not had symptoms for 72 hours.

## Absences Using DDA Funds / Respite Care

Participants who are choosing to use DDA funds/Respite Care funds to pay for activities with Pierce County Parks must call our office or email paula.selfridge@piercecountywa.gov 24 hours prior to missing an activity that you have registered for. Any activity missed that is deemed a no-call, no-show or payment denied from DDA WILL be billed to the participant and all class fees will be the participants responsibility.

## Unattended Classes / No-Shows

If for any reason, you/the participant does not show up for registered classes or is absent for any reason other than illness or behavioral related issues, you will be required to pay the published rate for those



**CANCELLATION POLICY:** You must request cancellation, and receive confirmation, from Pierce County Parks staff at least 5 business days before an activity begins for a refund. Refunds will not be made for missed or forgotten sessions, or late cancellations.



VIRTUAL PROGRAMS: For virtual activities, access to an internet capable computer/laptop/tablet/cell phone provided by the participant's parent/guardian is required for participation. A ZOOM link will be sent to the email address listed on the registration prior to the program's scheduled meeting.

classes. We cannot excuse absences related to caregiver or transportation issues, appointments or trips. Because we are unable to bill DDA for services not rendered, you will be required to pay out of pocket, and invoiced at the end of the month for the amount due.

## One to One Assistants, Care Providers, and Chaperones

We want everyone to have the opportunity to fully and independently participate in our activities, and we realize that some of our participants need assistance to make that possible. We allow for two different types of assistance, both of which require passing a background check before attending.

One to One (1:1) assistants and care providers may attend a program or activity at no additional cost with a registered participant when that person needs assistance with feeding, toileting, behavioral support, or ambulation. Our staff may evaluate and determine the need for a 1:1 assistant at any time.

There may be times when the space in the busses for transportation is limited and staff evaluate who needs a 1:1 riding on the bus with us. In those cases, program staff will call the families and work out a plan that will have the 1:1 driving separate behind the bus. Priority would be for 1:1 assistants who need to constantly be with their clients due to behavioral needs or medical needs.

Chaperones may accompany registered participants as program support for ease of mind for an additional fee. Chaperones will need to provide their own transportation when we travel into the community.


