



# REGISTRATION INFORMATION



**REGISTRATION OPENS DEC 11:** Pre-Registration is required. Class sizes are limited. To register online, visit our website at **www.piercecountywa.gov/PCSR**. To register by phone, please call **(253) 798-4199**. Register in person at the **Lakewood Community Center**, 9112 Lakewood Drive, Lakewood, WA 98499, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.



**DDA:** Pierce County Parks Specialized Recreation programs are supported by DDA funding; respite money may be used. If using DDA funds to register please have the participant's case manager contact information on-hand.



GENERAL BILLING INFO: Case managers will be billed monthly, using the hourly reimbursement rate based on the guarter hour.

## Unexpected Absences

You will not be billed out of pocket for any illness or behavioral related issues as long as we are notified prior to the absence.

If you/the participant is sick or experiencing:

 Behavioral issues: If for any reason you feel you/the participant is not able to safely attend classes, please call and inform us at your earliest convenience. Safety is of our utmost concern.

 If you have any type of contagious illness: Please do not attend classes until you have not had symptoms for 72 hours.

### Unattended Classes / No-Shows

If for any reason, you/the participant does not show up for registered classes or is absent for any reason other than illness or behavioral related issues, you will be required to pay the published rate for those classes. We cannot excuse absences related to caregiver or transportation issues, appointments or trips. Because we are unable to bill DDA for services not rendered, you will be required to pay out of pocket, and invoiced at the end of the month for the amount due.



**CANCELLATION POLICY:** You must request cancellation, and receive confirmation, from Pierce County Parks staff at least 5 business days before an activity begins for a refund. Refunds will not be made for missed or forgotten sessions, or late cancellations.



VIRTUAL PROGRAMS: For virtual activities, access to an internet capable computer/laptop/tablet/cell phone provided by the participant's parent/guardian is required for participation. A ZOOM link will be sent to the email address listed on the registration prior to the program's scheduled meeting.

ACCOMODATION: To request accomodations, please call (253) 798-2997.

### One to One Assistants, Care Providers, and Chaperones

We want everyone to have the opportunity to fully and independently participate in our activities, and we realize that some of our participants need assistance to make that possible. We allow for two different types of assistance, both of which require passing a background check before attending.

One to One (1:1) assistants and care providers may attend a program or activity at no additional cost with a registered participant when that person needs assistance with feeding, toileting, behavioral support, or ambulation. Our staff may evaluate and determine the need for a 1:1 assistant at any time.


There may be times when the space in the busses for transportation is limited and staff evaluate who needs a 1:1 riding on the bus with us. In those cases, program staff will call the families and work out a plan that will have the 1:1 driving separate behind the bus. Priority would be for 1:1 assistants who need to constantly be with their clients due to behavioral needs or medical needs.

Chaperones may accompany registered participants as program support for ease of mind for an additional fee. Chaperones will need to provide their own transportation when we travel into the community.





# Specialized Habilitation

Specialized Habilitation provides individualized client centered opportunities to learn skills in:

- Self-Empowerment
- Safety awareness & self advocacy
- Interpersonal skills and effective communication
- Coping strategies regarding typical life challenges
- Learning how to manage daily tasks and gain new adaptive skills.

## What does that look like?

For some this is learning how to cook foods for a new doctor recommended diet. Shopping, menu planning, and learning how to prepare foods. It also looks like learning how to access the local gym safely and independently. It is also learning how to use devices to learn how to communicate with the folks in your life.



### **Community Inclusion**

January 1, 2023 Washington determined folks were eligible for dual services - which means they could have Employment services AND Community Inclusion (previously Community Access)!

- Individualized based on individual interest.

Community Engagement connects participants to activities, resources, events, and services in the community that the participant is interested in exploring as indicated in their personal goals in their person centered services plan PCSP.

- Connects clients to community supports.
- Supports clients natural abilities to communicate, socialize, and interact with others increasing their confidence to engage in events without ongoing support through experiential learning.

Benefit U helps people understand how employment and their disability related cash and medical benefits can work together.

Our mission is to provide customers with information, tools, and resources that empower them to navigate and make informed decisions about their life and benefits with confidence.

## BENEFIT U'S SERVICES INCLUDE:

#### Individualized Benefits Planning Services

Benefit Planning services include:

- Addressing questions or concerns related to disability benefits and work or additional income earned.
- Exploring work incentives which allow you to maximize earnings.
- Planning for life changes and how these may impact benefits.

Services through BenefitU are available to individuals who are 14 years of age and older and meet eligiblity requirements through the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA).

To request benefit planning services, please schedule an intake at: www.benefitu.org/service-eligibility

If not eligible through BenefitU for planning services, but <mark>still receiving</mark> other state or federal benefits, it can still be valuable to review how earned income may still impact current benefits.

### Seven steps for a happy and healthy holiday season

**OLYMPIA** –The Washington State Department of Health (DOH) wishes everyone a happy holiday season. Embrace the spirit and enjoy this special time of year by following these seven steps to keep yourself and your loved ones healthy.

**Take care of yourself.** While some people consider the holidays the most wonderful time of the year, others find this season difficult. Many people experience greater stress, anxiety, or loneliness this time of year. Choose activities that connect you to people or causes you care about, take breaks when you need them, and check in with your friends and family. If you or someone you love is dealing with a mental health crisis, substance use, or any type of emotional distress, you can call, text, or chat with the <u>988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline</u>. It's free, confidential, and available 24 hours per day.

**Prevent the spread of germs.** Remember to wash your hands often and avoid touching your eyes, mouth, and nose, where viruses can enter the body. Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not convenient. Get you and your family up to date on immunizations for COVID-19, flu, and RSV. It is important that if you feel sick for any reason, you stay home. Learn more about ways to protect yourself against respiratory illness this season <u>here</u>.

**Stay active.** Physical activity is great for our health. It improves sleep quality, lessens feelings of anxiety, and reduces blood pressure. Regular physical activity also lowers the risk for chronic conditions like heart disease, type 2 diabetes, and some cancers. Get creative and be active when you connect with friends and family this season – <u>go for a group walk</u> or hike together, shoot hoops, play flag football or another kind of active game together.

**Enjoy the food!** There's plenty of tasty food at the holidays. Have fun and focus on those special foods you love to eat this time of year. Take time and savor each bite and listen to your body to know when you're full.

**Don't serve up a foodborne illness.** Festive dinners and buffets can create more opportunities for contamination, but <u>you can reduce the risk by taking simple precautions</u>. Wash hands and surfaces often. Keep raw meat, poultry, and seafood separate to prevent cross-contamination. Cook food to a safe internal temperature and refrigerate leftovers right away to keep harmful bacteria at bay.

**Keep an eye on the weather.** The best time to <u>prepare for winter weather</u> is before the snow falls or ice forms. Bundle up to stay dry and warm, and make sure your family has warm layers, gloves, hats, scarves, and waterproof boots.

**Practice fire safety.** Most house fires happen in the winter and are often caused by cooking accidents, smoking, or unsafe use of woodstoves or space heaters. <u>Protect your home against fires</u> and have an emergency plan that you practice regularly.
